The PSYCS scholarship is an opportunity for undergraduate or Master's students to engage with cutting-edge interdisciplinary research at the University of St Andrews. We are offering this opportunity to students that are willing to collaborate part-time on projects being led by academic staff in the Schools of Psychology and Computer Science.

We seek: motivated students (undergraduate or master) of the Computer Science or the Psychology department who are available 15h per week between February and the end of June of 2012 (the timing of these hours can be very flexible).

We offer:

- real experience, supervised by leading researchers;
- a stipend of £ 1,175 (for 16 weeks of scholarship);
- work with state of the art human interface technology;
- a good first step towards grad school;
- flexible hours and study-compatible schedule;
- the possibility of being an author in scientific publications;
- a personal work space in one of the labs.

- a CV or Résumé that indicates your current level (e.g., Psych, 3<sup>rd</sup> year);
- a description of your programming or psychology experience. You do not have to have both. If from Psychology, please, include a list of the five topics that interest you most and the generic description of one experiment that you have performed/designed. If from Computer Science, please, describe what level of programming you are able of (e.g., describe the largest/most sophisticated program that you have ever built, and the programming languages you are proficient in);
- a paragraph (two to six sentences) on why you are interested in this opportunity;
- your time availability (e.g., from end of exams to mid May) and any other restrictions.

Please, send this information as soon as possible, and before the end of January.

You will be contacted at the beginning of February at the latest.
